PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

It's been a busy few months for the Parish Council.

The Council addressed a range of issues raised by residents since March including: condition of stile at Bolam Lane, general road surface conditions in the village, and the dangerous wall (now removed) at Buckton Gate. Traffic issues continue to be of concern and are raised with appropriate bodies on a regular basis.

Local planning applications were considered routinely, proposals for planting projects (for trees and verge flowers) were approved, the request for a contribution to the HART bus service was granted, and decisions about the Community Coronation Grant made. The Parish Council was able to give the gift of a money box to each of the children at Bempton Primary School with a grant from the Coronation Fund

After meetings with the Conservation Team urgent works were approved to reduce the negative impacts of tree overgrowth on Bempton Pond's water volume and water quality. Thorough checks of the island ensured it was free from nesting birds before work started.

The Community Payback team painted railings on the green and a wild-life wall was created.

Nominations and approvals of candidates by EYCC for the Parish Council occurred at election time in May. Two resignations left gaps on the Council after re-appointments were made.

Anne Watkinson stood and was elected in May and Paula McCourt will be co-opted at the next Parish Council meeting in September. We look forward to working with both of them. Decisions on responsibilities of individual councillors, including playground rotas and defibrillator monitoring, were made in June and these are recorded in meeting minutes. Don't forget that meetings of the Parish Council are always open to the public and are generally held on the third Tuesday of the month. There will be no meeting in August and all other variations on the date will be communicated on-line and on the village notice-boards.

The Parish Council wishes all our residents a very pleasant summer break.

PANTRY UPDATE

The food pantry continues to support those struggling with the cost of living. Without school meals, family food bills rise during the holidays. Remember the smallest donation makes a difference. Non-perishable food items, laundry products and toiletries are still needed. Barrie at the Post Office, Maureen Burnell at the Drop-In, Maureen Burton at Church, and Annie at 3 Gillus Lane will all be about to take your donations during the summer break. Dear Parishoners

Summer 2023

I am a keen walker and, recently, whilst walking on Flamborough headland to take in the scenery, I bent to pick up a white feather.

I soon found I had forgotten the view; my eyes were fixed on the ground looking to add to my growing collection of seabird plumage.

I then noticed other people ignoring the beauty of the land and sea around them. One man, eyes glued to his binoculars was searching for a rare seabird; a young couple were scanning the grass intent on finding a lost golf ball; a woman was trying to get the camera on her mobile in the right position to take a selfie and another, in search of something particular, was scrolling through her Smart-phone; a sixth person (a man) lay, eyes closed on the grass, taking a rest.

Did we all find what we were looking for? I don't know - but it seemed to me to be a parable about life.

We often spend so much time focused on what is directly in front of us we forget the bigger picture of our lives. For a while, I failed to see the glorious blue sea, white fluffy clouds and majestic chalk cliffs and they were all ignored by those I saw on my walk. Life can throw up all kinds of distractions which seek to grab our minds and energy and it is easy to forget what we really want out of our lives. Famous people in the news are often there because they have made power or wealth or fame their goal – but what are we, as ordinary people, really seeking from our lives.

There is a verse from the Bible that says 'Ask, and you will receive, seek and you will find, knock and the door will be opened.' But first, we need to ask ourselves 'what is it I really want?'



EARLY YEARS - PUFFIN CLASS

In Puffin Class the nursery / reception suite has been purposefully resourced to help curious children become immersed in language and investigation. They have wonderful opportunities for sustained play and skill development designed to cultivate a love of learning that will last all their lives.

The Early Years Team has equipped separate subject areas, providing daily opportunities for talking and enquiry and space to test ideas, experience success and failure and begin to understand the world they live in. From the first day they are helped to develop social skills, regulate emotional responses and face challenges with enthusiasm, building resilience in a safe and supportive environment.

Home visits from the Headteacher and the EYFS staff are now routine so key adults are included from the start. If someone you know seeks a place where working with parents is prioritised, where observations of your child's learning journey are shared, where home additions can be added to an online Early Years Journal (called Tapestry) and individual interests can be discussed and built on in school, then our school is the place to start. Mums and Tots: Over two school terms we have had the opportunity to see babies become toddlers and shy tots start to take part in sing song and story time with big smiles on their rosy faces. Early social interaction is an important foundation for nursery and school and it's great to see confidence building in tots' interactions with nursery children, staff and volunteers. Not been yet?
